Bible

Curriculum Name/Publisher: God's Big Picture

Overview:

"God's Big Picture takes you and your kids through a majestic gallery of the major characters and themes of God's Word. Its chronological approach will give your students an understanding of the Bible as a picture of God's plan and purposes."

Memorization of the names of the books of the Bible, the 23rd Psalm, John 3:16, the Lord's Prayer, and a verse for each letter of the alphabet.

Phonics

Curriculum Name/Publisher: Saxon

Overview:

- reinforce upper and lower case letter recognition
- develop phonemic awareness of each letter sound while working towards reading fluency
- introduce and practice consonant blends and digraphs
- practice reading and writing frequently used sight words
- develop oral communication skills through reading aloud

Handwriting

Overview:

- using child friendly techniques to introduce and practice Saxon block style lettering
- reinforce proper use of all forms of writing and coloring instruments
- practice forming letters by keeping the pencil on the paper for cursive preparation

Mathematics
